The President called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM Salute to the Flag; the Open Public Meetings Act Compliance Statement was read. Commissioner Piperno was absent.

ITEMS TO BE DISCUSSED:

Public Hearing – Well Maintenance Contract

Mr. McConnell requested to table this as the Staff is still negotiating certain language in the draft contract. Staff asked the Commissioners for any input regarding this lengthy contract. The Commissioners asked to review the contract documents and will provide Counsel with any comment or concerns within a week.

MPWC - Annual Report to Governments

Mr. Saraceni stated that he will be scheduling the 2016 annual reports to Pennsauken Committee and Merchantville Council shortly and will advise the Commissioners of those dates. It was suggested by Mr. Brennan and Mr. Johnson that the report include an accounting of all services that the MPWC provides to them.

<u>Haddon Pointe Project Development – Application Received</u>

Mr. Saraceni stated that we were in receipt of the application for the Haddon Pointe Project Development. The application was to tie into the 12" and 8" mains on Haddonfield Road. The total fee due is \$204,422.50.

<u>Longwood Avenue Project – Paving – Change Order – Time Extension</u>

Mr. Spafford stated that the contractor requested a 180 day extension for the contract deadline. This is due in part to the weather conditions and availability of asphalt. He recommends the change order.



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<u>Clements Avenue Tank – Pennsauken Police Department Request</u>

Mr. Saraceni stated that the Pennsauken Police Department requested permission to install camera transmitters on the Clements Avenue tank in support of their Westfield Avenue community security program. Mr. Spafford informed Commissioners that there is sufficient room on the tank. Commissioners endorsed approval.

Pennsauken Schools - Lead Testing

Mr. Saraceni stated that a meeting is scheduled with Pennsauken School Officials for 1/17/2017 which includes Richard Spafford, Craig Campbell and himself to lend guidance to the Pennsauken Public Schools in lead testing in the schools. Mr. Saraceni also stated that the MPWC would provide access to the MPWC contracted lab, if necessary. The MPWC would anticipate reviewing the results.

Recruitment Initiatives - Plant Operator/Field Service Technician

Mr. Saraceni stated that several candidates were interviewed for the Plant Operator and Field Service Technician positions. He would like permission to hire 2 Plant operators and a Field Service Technician. Mr. Saraceni also thanked Angela Waldron for all her help with the hiring process.

The President called the meeting to order at 4:02 PM Salute to the Flag; the Open Public Meetings Act Compliance Statement was read. In attendance in the public were Mr. John Romeo from Vornado, and Ricky Lukasiak, and several employees and their relatives.

ITEMS TO BE DISCUSSED:

Customer Account Appeal

Mr. Saraceni introduced Mr. John Romeo, property manager for Vornado on Route 38, Cherry Hill. Mr. Romeo stated that the 2016 4th quarter bill was \$13,925.00 due to an undetected water leak. He was requesting relief from this bill or the penalties. The Commission advised that it was historically consistent that unless the Commission was somehow the cause, that customers must pay for water once it passed through the customer's meter. He was instructed to speak to staff regarding removal of late fees while the appeal was pending and if he wanted a payment plan.

Government Presentations – Township 3/1 – Borough 2/27

Mr. Saraceni stated that the Government deliveries will be at Merchantville borough on 2/27/17 and Pennsauken Township on 3/1/17.

National Highway – Authorization to bid tank painting.

Mr. Spafford requested authorization to go to bid for the National Highway tank painting which will be an overcoat to only the outside of the tank. This project was budgeted for 2017 at \$250,000.

Chapel Avenue Main Replacement – authorization to bid project

Mr. Spafford requested authorization to go to bid for the Chapel Ave. main replacement. This project was budgeted for 2017 at \$650,000.

Park Avenue Tank - Logo - Progress Report

Mr. Scavuzzo reported that Pennsauken Township previously requested to utilize the MPWC Pennsauken's 125 Anniversary logo on Park Ave. tank. Pennsauken had since made a slight alteration to the logo. The Commissions' contractor had already prepared the stencil in the originally approved version and to make the revision would cost an additional \$2000. Commissioners were given both examples of logos (original and the altered). The Commission agreed to maintain the original logo already prepared by the contractor.

Residency Policy - Submitted Proposal

The Commissioners each discussed the proposed amendment to the MPWC residency policy submitted by employee R. Lukasiak. Commissioner Piperno provided an overview and background of his actions taken to research the history of this policy with the MPWC. All information was gathered and shared with all Commissioners prior to this meeting. His summary remarks expressed an unwillingness to amend as requested. The employee, Lukasiak was permitted to comment. The Commission saw no reason to adjust the policy as requested at this time, but acknowledged that the policy will likely continue to be a topic in the future.

Recruitment Initiative - Field Service Technician

Mr. Saraceni reported several candidates were interviewed for a field service technician to replace Glenn Bierbach, who is retiring in May. Mr. Saraceni provided information to the Commissioners for background on the 3 new hires that have already started and were doing well in their new positions.

Chief Operating Officer:

Mr. Saraceni reported the National AWWA Conference will be held in Philadelphia on June 11th-14th 2017 and the Commissioners will be sent the information. The C.O.O. asked the Commissioners to inform him who would chose to attend and on which day. Mr. Saraceni also informed the Commissioners of the NJAWWA Conference will be held in Atlantic City in March if anyone is interested in that conference.



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Mr. Saraceni advised about the inability to resolve issues that the Finance Dept. have been having with the new Edmunds accounting software program for the past 5 months. Mr. German noted that our auditors and accounting consultants had also been engaged to assist but without success. Therefore the decision would be to transition back to the updated version of the previous software.

The President called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM Salute to the Flag; the Open Public Meetings Act Compliance Statement was read.

ITEMS TO BE DISCUSSED:

Well Maintenance Program - Public Hearing

President Scavuzzo turned the meeting over to Mr. McConnell to conduct the scheduled public hearing. Refer to the Well Maintenance Hearing transcript for complete minutes.

Water Fountain Dedications & Merchantville Historical Society - Public Presentation

Employee Sean Fitzgerald informed the Commissioners that Merchantville's Historical Society would like to dedicate an entire month to MPWC history and he requested permission to speak on MPWC's behalf and to provide MPWC historical pictures for the presentation. The presentation will be held at the Merchantville Community Center on March 22, at 8:00pm. The Commissioners agreed and thanked Mr. Fitzgerald for his participation. Ms. Eisenmann then requested permission to a formal dedication of the donated water fountains on 4/28/17 in coordination with Arbor day. The Commissioners agreed and Ms. Eisenmann stated that she will contact the mayors and committees.

Collingswood Water Utility - Follow-up Discussion

Mr. Brennan informed the Commissioners and staff that the Collingswood Water Utility may be interested in seeking services and assistance from the MPWC. He then requested to proceed with setting up a meeting with Collingswood and MPWC Staff to which it was agreed.

Shared Service Agreement - Township Vehicle Maintenance - Renewal

Mr. Saraceni stated that the Shared Service Agreement for Vehicle Maintenance is up for renewal. Karl McConnell indicated that he would also recommend amending the "Indemnification" clause that the new rate once approved and provided to him would be inserted.



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Shared Services Agreement – Street Opening

Mr. Saraceni reported that he met with Director of Pennsauken Public Works, his Deputy, Mr. Ferriozi, MPWC Engineer Rich Spafford and General Counsel to discuss a Shared Services Agreement for Street Opening with the Pennsauken Department of Public Works. This agreement would cover Pennsauken only, asphalt only and in Township streets only less than 10' by 10'. A discussion ensued and it was agreed that this new information including all rate information and payment details, will be incorporated into a new draft and distributed prior to the April Commission meeting with an intention for a tentative start date of May 1st, 2017.

Well Maintenance Program – Approve Contract and Authorize Service

The transcript of the public hearing with exhibits were provided in advance for the Commissioners and no public comment was received during the open comment period. Permission was requested to approve the USCI Well Maintenance Services contract and to authorize applications to the State Agencies as required by the relevant Act.

Collingswood Water Utility - Follow-up Discussion

Mr. Brennan and staff met with Collingswood Business Administrator Keith Hastings about a possible shared service agreement. Collingswood is concerned with their succession planning status once the current superintendent retires and is also in need of licensing and treatment expertise. Mr. Hastings will contact Mr. Saraceni to pursue further after he confers with the Superintendent and township officials. Shared Services Agreement - Street Opening

Staff Reports:

Mr. Saraceni informed the Commissioners of Glenn Bierbach's upcoming retirement. A luncheon will be held on 4/26 at 11:30am and Commissioners are welcome.

Mr. Saraceni advised of staff finding 10 meter failures in the last 2 weeks. The Neptune representative who met with staff advised that Neptune would stand behind the Commission to make whole any damages to our customers. That Vendor will assess those meters and report back. Staff will continue to research to identify any possible causal relationships and will report back upon completion.

Mr. Campbell informed the Commissioners that the MPWC was again the winner of the NJAWWA "Best Tasting Water In NJ" Contest for 2017, just as it was in 2015. Mr. Saraceni stated that we are hoping to have an award presentation at a future Commission meeting.

Ms. Eisenmann advised that the Fountain Dedication and Arbor Day presentations for April 28th have been confirmed with the Mayors of both Merchantville and Pennsauken who will attend respectively starting at 9:00am at the Merchantville site and approx. 9:30 at the Pennsauken site. Borough Main Re-lining Pilot- Authorization

NJDEP Regulations-PFOA and PFNA Regulations

Mr. Campbell stated that the NJ Drinking Water Quality Institute (advisory board for NJDEP) has recommended regulating at lower levels both PFOA and PFNA. The state administration has accepted this recommendation and will implement. Both PFOA and PFNA will now have a regulated MCL (maximum contaminant level). A timeline for implementation has not been released by NJDEP yet. GAC has greater than 90% success with removal and is currently only at the Marion Ave. plant. Additionally,1,4 dioxane and 1,2,3 TCP are still under review.

Salary Committee-Proposal to Commission

Each Commissioner was given a copy of the proposal and was asked to review them for the December Meeting. Mr. German stated that he was recommending a 2% increase for all salaried personnel.
