WHEREAS, the Commissioners at its meeting of January 11, 2018 approved the contract and payment of billed service to Root 24, Inc. of emergency main break services; and the MPWC Director of Engineering and the C.O.O. both declared an Emergency pursuant to the MPWC SOP # 1200 and the Emergency Procedures approved by the Commissioners on 7/10/2014; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commissioners of the MPWC on this 11th day of January 2018 in its duly advertised and publicly held monthly meeting, the Commission hereby authorizes, approves and ratifies nunc pro tunc the Declaration of Emergency and the work, payment and compensation authorized to the Contractor as awarded and paid under this emergency contract that was awarded and approved at that time and hereby authorizes any necessary transfer of funds to cover this unexpected cost.

RESOLUTION TO SET THE COMMISSION'S BID THRESHOLD AND TO AUTHORIZE AGENTS FOR PURCHASES UNDER BID THRESHOLD

WHEREAS, the Merchantville-Pennsauken Water Commission (hereafter the MPWC or Commission) is a public entity and a body politic of the State of New Jersey created pursuant to New Jersey Statutes 40:62-108 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has the authority and the duty to provide for the orderly and efficient operation of the Commission, finances, and water supply and quality; and

SCHEDULE A- FORM

Description of Surplus items to be sold online:

- 1) For those items that are part of the local unit's fixed asset inventory, the description of items must also include information that sufficiently identifies the item and provides an audit trail (i.e., inventory or serial number).
- 2) For items not in the fixed asset inventory, the resolution must provide a general description sufficient to inform the public of the item being sold.
- 3) The listing for any motorized vehicle that is titled in the name of the local unit must include the vehicle identification number (VIN) shown on the title. Local units must comply with applicable statutes regarding abandoned property, confiscated vehicles, etc.

SEPARATE LEGAL ADVERTISING REQUIRED

A legal newspaper advertisement informing the public as to the nature of items being sold and how to obtain more information on the sale is required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-36. An advertisement must be published in conjunction with **each** authorizing resolution. The advertisement must be published in the local unit's official newspaper and shall:

- a. Announce the auction and that the item(s) will be sold online.
- b. Include the internet address for the sale that is being advertised.
- c. Include the date and time of the auction, and a general description of the surplus personal property intended to be sold. Specific information for particular items, such as the VIN for vehicles, is not required to be included in such newspaper advertisements.
- d. Include a statement that bidders must pre-register with the approved vendor and the internet address with registration information.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-36, sales shall be held not less than 7 or more than 14 days after the latest publication of the advertisement.

6. The online auction company may provide an option of continuing or reopening a sale after the close (i.e., in the event a minimum reserve price was not met). The potential for this occurrence must be provided for in agreement between the local unit and the auction company and the provision clear to bidders from the sale webpage. In the event of a continuance or re-opening, those bidders who participated in the sale must be notified of the new date. <u>Under these circumstances an additional public advertisement is not required.</u>

WHEREAS, the long-term agreement for a program of inspection, rehabilitation, maintenance of the infrastructure and replacement of water mains as required by the Water Quality Accountability Act (WQAA), P.L. 2017, c. 133, (N.J.S.A. 58:31-1 et seq.) are the subject hereof is the type of program of services and work for which the Water Supply Public-Private Contracting Act, codified at N.J.S.A. § 58:26-19, et seq., was enacted; and

WHEREAS, the Commission staff seeks to utilized the aforesaid statute to issue a Request for Proposals ("RFP") for an anticipated long-term service contract to be publicly advertised in newspaper and on the Internet website maintained by the MPWC using public solicitation of proposals with criteria established in writing prior to the opening of proposals and said proposals to be submitted and publicly opened and announced; and to take all other actions necessary under The New Jersey Water Supply Public-Private Contracting Act, codified at N.J.S.A. § 58:26-19, et seq., to seek a partner for such a aggressive infrastructure maintenance and replacement plan; and

WHEREAS, as directed by the statute this process credits and takes into account the criteria applied including such factors as the financial and technical capabilities of the private contractor; the reasonableness of the contract terms; the protection of the public/water customers from risks or subsidization of the contract; the financial terms and ability to budget for the Commission and impact of the contract on its ability to repay its indebtedness; and inclusion of statutorily required terms (i.e., subjects that must be addressed by the contract); and
